Banner Casa Grande to expand Women and Infant Services

CASA GRANDE, Ariz. (May 6, 2016) — In an effort to enhance Women and Infant services, Banner Casa Grande Medical Center is set to break ground for an expanded Obstetrical Care Unit at 12:30 p.m. Monday, May 9, at the facility, 1800 E. Florence Blvd.

The new 27,800-square-foot unit will feature the highest level of medical technologies for these services, ensuring a safe and nurturing environment and delivering expert care for all. The new unit will offer expanded labor, delivery and recovery rooms, and private rooms for both mother and baby. The hospital will continue to offer the Joe Jonas Nursery where babies may be attended to while the mother recuperates.

“This project comes at a great time,” said Rona Curphy, CEO of Banner Casa Grande Medical Center. “We recently began offering Level II Perinatal Services, with the capability to care for high-risk pregnancies. Since April 2015 we have added Neonatal Nurse Practitioners in our nursery 24/7/365. This expansion will serve a real need in this community.”

Earlier this year, Banner Casa Grande completed its Level II Perinatal Services Survey with the Arizona Prenatal Trust. The hospital was recognized for its goal to provide exceptional care to high-risk pregnant mothers, and to newborn infants born at 32 weeks and above.
