Fitzgibbons Announces Re-Election Bid for Casa Grande City Council

Today, Lisa Navarro Fitzgibbons announced her candidacy for re-election to the Casa Grande City Council. “I want to continue my focus on attracting new businesses to Casa Grande, improving our quality of life, helping keep Casa Grande a safe community to raise our families, as well as being fiscally responsible”.

“Over the past 10 years, the city has made progress to address many issues. I want to continue to provide my experience and perspective to ensure Casa Grande continues to implement sound economic development and improve efforts to increase diversity at all levels. “

Fitzgibbons was elected to the City Council in 2011 after being appointed to fill a vacancy. She attended Casa Grande elementary and high schools and received her Bachelor of Science degree from Arizona State University.

Fitzgibbons work experience includes time with Shearson Lehman Brothers in New York City, Xerox Corporation in Phoenix, Office of the Governor for the State of Arizona, and ten years with the Pepsi Cola Company in Phoenix. Currently, Fitzgibbons serves as Director of Business Development and Marketing at Fitzgibbons Law Offices, P.L.C. in Casa Grande. Lisa is married to Denis and they have three grown daughters. All three daughters attended schools in Casa Grande.

Fitzgibbons said “I know when I first ran, I made the point that before we can be a great city, we need to be a safe city”. Now, several years later with our improvements in public safety, we are a safe city. However, we face many new challenges with the health and safety of our community. We have started a homelessness initiative that is critical but need to address the growing concerns of mental health and drugs and how it affects our community.”
