

ORDINANCE NO. 1397.10.05

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CASA GRANDE, ARIZONA, AMENDING CHAPTER 10.08.160 RELATING TO THE RESTRICTION OF PARKING ON RESIDENTIAL STREETS; ADDING SECTION 10.08.300 TO CHAPTER 10.08 PERMITTING CITY CODE ENFORCEMENT TO HAVE ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY OF PARKING REGULATIONS; ESTABLISHING THE SEVERABILITY OF THE VARIOUS SECTIONS; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CASA GRANDE, ARIZONA:

Section 1: Chapter 10.08.160, Casa Grande Municipal Code, regarding restricting parking on residential streets, is hereby amended to read in its entirety as follows:

10.08.160 Parking of certain vehicles on residential streets restricted.

No person shall stand or park a vehicle with a gross vehicle weight rating in excess of 12,000 pounds, or a tractor, semi-truck, recreational vehicle, bus, boat, or any trailer designed to be towed by a motor vehicle, on a street in a residentially zoned area, with the following exceptions for such vehicles:

- A. Vehicles providing delivery or services within a residential area may park or stop for the limited purpose of loading or unloading or providing the service;
- B. Vehicles owned by a person residing in the residential area may park or stop the vehicle for the purpose of loading or unloading or for a period of up to two hours for any other purpose not otherwise prohibited by law;
- C. Emergency Vehicles when responding to a call for service or providing necessary emergency services; and
- D. Vehicles specifically permitted to park pursuant to state law, if any.

Section 2: New Section 10.08.300 is hereby added to Chapter 10, Casa Grande Municipal Code, regarding dual enforcement of parking regulations, is hereby added to read in its entirety as follows:

10.08.300 Additional Enforcement Authority – Code Enforcement Officers.

In addition to the enforcement authority prescribed in Section 10.04.010 to the police chief, any code enforcement officer employed by the City may enforce any section of this Chapter relating to parking, blocking traffic, and abandoned vehicles by seeking voluntary compliance, issuing notices of violation, and issuing civil complaints.

Section 3: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance or any part of any code or amendment adopted herein by reference is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

Section 4: The provisions of this ordinance are effective on and after _____, 2019.
